

The plight of pensioners in Nigeria with reference to Enugu state.

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Abstract

The purpose of the study was to find out the plight of pensions with reference to Enugu The design of the study was descriptive survey. The population of the study is ten thousand (10,000) out of which random sampling technique was applied. The questionnaire was the instrument used for data selection. The data collected were analyzed in chi-square (x2). After the analysis, the following among others were found: 1. that retirement in the past was a thing of joy because the retirees had their salaries and retirement benefits paid to them promptly. 2. That pensioners felt proud and fulfilled in life. 3. That the plight present day pensioners is horrifying, a nightmare, a curse sort of because of retirement. Benefits are usually never paid on time if at all hence prospective retirees falsify their ages to remain in service. 4. That the retirees were usually owed huge

arrears of salaries with the result that the retirees leave. The paper recommended that Government should make a policy reform or create ministry for pensioners as to carter wholly for all retirees.

Introduction

All over the federation of Nigeria, before 1990, civil and public servants waited eagerly for their retirement from service. This was because they were sure of the benefits accruing from such a transition, from active service to a position of a "senior citizen". Workers who could not build their own houses did so immediately retirement. Others purchased cars while others switched into a flourishing business enterprises. At times, workers who did not attain retirement ages retired voluntarily knowing that when paid their benefits and the usual monthly pensions, would make them better off, to start other private business while getting their pensions.

The situation began to change when workers who's retired voluntarily were not



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paid anything until their counterparts actually retired from service. Worse till, even those who got to their retirement ages began to be treated with disdain. They began to be referred to as dead woods by the politicians because of bureaucratic bottlenecks and governments insensitivity to their plight. Government has been in arrears for older pensioners for the past ten years. There was no time, they are not being owed some months. Pension scheme were not being harmonized. Because of the pitiable plight of the retirees workers now falsify their ages to avert early retirement. In fact, retirement is a terror to ageing servicemen.

Statement of the problems

One significant socio-economic problem with implication is the non-payment of pensions and other retirement benefits to pensions/retiring officers. A worker has his salaries reduced by certain percentage with the aim of saving up the balance for his retirement days. In Enugu State for example, a teacher's salary is shed off and set aside for his pension and gratuity.

Another percentage is also set aside as federal mortgage bank housing loan. Yet another percentage is set out as Endwell scheme and son on. But as soon as the person retires, his troubles begin. He encountered difficulties in order to enlist his name on the pension program for the next one year. When eventually enlisted, he does not get any payment for another one year. He would wish he had not retired. The implications of these problems are untimely death of the retiring officers or his defendant.

Methodology

Research Design:

The design of the research work is descriptive survey.

The area of study is Enugu State.

Population of the study:

The population of the study was ten thousand (10,000) people (pensioners)

Sample and sampling technology:

Out of the above population, three hundred (300) respondents were randomly selected, made up of one hundred (100)



pensioners from each of the three zones of the state: Enugu North, East and West.

The instrument used for collection of data was the questionnaire.

Validity of the instrument:

To ensure validity of the research questioners the set of drafted questions was sent to an expert in research supervision, who ensured that the questions were clearly appropriate and covered the research objective of the study.

Reliability of the Instrument

The instrument was there after used on a pre-test exercise on forty (40) subjects. The test was repeated after two weeks and the results pooled together.

Method of data Collection

The researcher had two assistants to help distribute the questionnaire to the three hundred (300) respondents who were allowed two weeks to complete them after which they were collected back

Method of data Analysis

The data collected was analyzed in chisquare (x^2)
