Penrose (2012) argued that it is only with appropriate resources and capabilities that can be developed in a sustainable over long term that manner a entrepreneurs achieve sustainable competitive advantage and success.

The theory holds that an entrepreneur achieves resounding success when there is good understanding of the resource potentials, through good vision, intuition and creative act. an entrepreneur chooses a particular business where resources that, are valuable are, hard to copy and resources that are non-substitutable, the Entrepreneur

will not only be able to succeed but enjoy long term Competitive advantage and economic success. Without sustainable competitive advantage entrepreneurs' successes are ephemeral as competitors quickly obliterate the successful outcome of the initial effort (Udu, et al 2010).

The theory laid emphasis on the need for an entrepreneur to possess the required capabilities and resources as prerequisite condition necessary for achieving a sustained competitive advantage. aforementioned addresses the need for small scale enterprises to be, proactive giving the changing business environment.
